In addition to offering routine pre-bookable and on the day appointments with our doctors we also hold a daily **EMERGENCY** duty doctor clinic.

The purpose of this clinic is to enable our patients, who have a sudden unexpected medical issues which they feel **CANNOT** wait until another day to have an on the day appointment.

Appointments are booked in order throughout the day and whilst patients are given an appointment time it is explained to them that they may experience a delay in being seen or called. The reason for potential delays is that our Emergency Doctor has to deal with <u>all</u> emergencies that come in during the day. This can include having to go out on urgent house calls in the middle of a surgery; dealing with urgent telephone calls with patients, and other healthcare professionals and of course seeing all of our registered patients who feel they need to be seen on the same day.

e-Consultations

We are excited to announce that we have just launched 'eConsult' for our patients. The service is available on eConsult Consult your GP Online

the practice website. It allows patients to ask for advice about their health conditions and symptoms or request sick notes via an online consultation form. Patients can also request administrative help or get general advice.

You can complete an eConsult at any time day or night, 7 days per week and we will get back to you by the end of the following working day with the next steps (e.g an econsult submitted on Sunday would be responded to by Tuesday at 18:30). We may respond by message, text or telephone call so it is vitally important to ensure that your mobile numbers are kept up to date.

You can go to our practice website, click on 'eConsult – Consult your GP online' and tell us what you want advice or help for. Then fill out a quick online form and the practice will get back to you by the end of the following working day with the next steps. This means you will not need to come into the surgery unless the GP requests a face to face appointment. You may receive a call, email or text from the surgery with the next steps or to let you know your prescription is ready to collect.

New Urgent Eyecare Service

A new Urgent Eye Care Service (CUES) is now available in Bedfordshire and Luton. If you have a new minor eye care problem that needs urgent or emergency care you can be assessed and treated by opticians as part of our Urgent Eye Care Service. All adults and children over the age of 2 registered with a local GP in the Bedfordshire or Luton areas can use the service for free. Children under 16 years must be accompanied at their appointment by an adult. The COVID-19 pandemic has had an impact on the availability of a number of routine health services. The NHS is keen to ensure urgent eye care is delivered safely in the community through remote triage and consultations (by telephone or video), to minimise face to face appointments and make use of technology to reduce patient-practitioner contact time. The Urgent Eye Care Service will reduce pressure on busy GP practices and hospital eye services / ophthalmology departments by making use of the network of local opticians in our area to treat urgent and emergency minor eye care problems. Typical conditions that can be treated under the service include; a red or painful eye, removal of foreign body, sudden loss or change in vision, flashes and floaters abd dry eye or grityy
